

Construction has begun!

Yes, construction has begun on Dynamic Entertainment's new restaurant and banquet hall. Not only that, but they have already begun booking weddings and other events for 2017.

Exciting news, but it comes with a price. Due to the extensive construction safety fencing to permit the work crews to safely utilize heavy equipment and construction materials, access to Guild Park is limited to pedestrian traffic in 2016. As a result, many popular events will not happen this summer, as hosting large events would be difficult and possibly hazardous due to construction.

The **Guild Festival Theatre's** summer production on the Greek Theatre is cancelled, as is our own **Guild Alive with Culture** as well as the **movie nights** presented by Friends of Guild Park. Even the GVCA's **Guildwood Day Barbeque** will be held elsewhere this summer. **But all these events will be back in 2017**, which will be a year of celebration. Not only the new restaurant, but also the 85th anniversary of the Guild of All Arts, the 35th anniversary of the Greek Theatre, and the 150th anniversary of Canada!

More good news! Planning discussions are ramping up with City officials for the cultural aspects and events in the rest of the park – not only Spencer Clark's office (that grey bunker-like building with the frieze from The Globe and Mail on the exterior) but also the Sculptors' Cabin, the log cabin and the Greek

Theatre. Park stakeholders (the Guild Renaissance Group, the Guildwood Village Community Association, the Guild Festival Theatre and Friends of Guild Park and Gardens) are meeting regularly to present a united front in requesting the best utilization of the Guild's precious assets.

Other improvements include lighting, paths, washrooms, forest maintenance, and other critical items which will make Guild Park a family friendly, destination park where art meets nature, with enhanced passive recreation, protection of natural heritage systems, revitalized cultural landscape structure, conservation of cultural heritage resources, while telling the story of the Clarks and their "Guild of All Arts".

Consultations and planning continue on the T.R.C.A.'s Scarborough Waterfront Project.

Nuit Blanche - 2017

Guild Park and Gardens has been added to the list of possible venues for Nuit Blanche in 2017. This could be the start of something big. We're keeping our fingers crossed that it happens!
